We're looking for parents and carers to join our advisory group for the LION-CUB study - an NIHR funded project at Imperial College London.

What is this study about?

Not every child has the same risk of being admitted to intensive care or the same experience once they're there. We want to understand how factors like ethnicity, poverty, language and access to healthcare affect this, so we can make care fairer for everyone.

Who are we looking for?

We are looking for parents or carers of a child under 16 who has stayed in a paediatric intensive care unit (PICU).



You don't need any research experience

Your experience as a parent or carer is what matters. We will provide all the background information you need, and meetings will be friendly and informal.

We particularly want to hear from parents from different ethnicities and who speak different languages, including those who haven't felt research was for them before. The strength of this study depends on hearing voices that are under-represented in research.
